## LOCATION

Ejea is located in the northeast of the peninsula in the Ebro River valley. It is 300 km from Madrid and 300 km from Barcelona. The capital of our region of Aragon is Zaragoza, a big city of 700,000 inhabitants.



Ejea is surrounded by two rivers, Arba de Biel and Arba de Luesia. The landscape is dominated by many bushes such as thyme, rosemary and kerries oak. Pines, black poplars, and willows are some of the trees that grow in Ejea.

It has a Mediterranean climate, with hot summers and cold winters and a north wind called "cierzo".



## JOBS PEOPLE DO

The main economical resources come from agriculture. Other sources of revenue include livestock, industry, and services.

Important products are olive oil, cheese, almonds, honey, rice and wine.
